# 1. Introduction

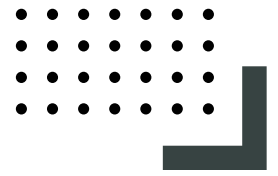

These trainings focused on Tailoring and Handloom Operations, providing participants with a blend of theoretical knowledge and intensive practical exposure to foster independent income-generating capabilities.

# 3. Training Objectives



The training programmes were designed with the following core objectives:

## TECHNICAL PROFICIENCY

To provide basic and practical knowledge of specialized tools and machinery.

## MAINTENANCE

To equip participants with the skills to repair and maintain their own equipment.

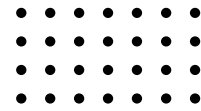
## SUSTAINABILITY

To introduce time management concepts and safety measures to ensure productive and safe working environments

## OPERATIONAL SKILLS

To train participants on specific techniques such as body measurement and garment design for tailoring, or bobbin binding and jacquard techniques for handloom.





# 4. Detailed Training Modules

## 4.1 TAILORING TRAINING PROGRAMME



A three-day Tailoring Training Programme was successfully conducted for Rural Women Entrepreneurs (RWEs) at Kaharpara, Rani, Kamrup (R), Assam from 22nd February to 24th February 2026. The objective of the training was to provide participants with short yet thorough practical and theoretical knowledge on essential tailoring skills to enhance their livelihood opportunities

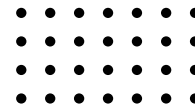


### OBJECTIVES OF THE TRAINING

- To provide basic knowledge of body measurement techniques.
- To introduce fundamental garment design concepts.
- To develop time management skills in tailoring work.
- To provide hands-on training in sewing machine stitching.
- To train participants on sewing machine repairing and regular maintenance.

### TRAINER DETAILS

The training was conducted by a skilled local trainer having 6–7 years of experience in the tailoring field. Being from the local area, the trainer was able to effectively communicate with the participants and provide practical demonstrations suited to their needs.



## TRAINING MODULES COVERED

The tailoring sessions focused on creating a foundation for independent garment production and machine upkeep.

### Day 1: Fundamentals

- Introduction to tailoring tools and materials
- Body measurement techniques
- Basic design understanding
- Cutting methods



### Day 2: Machine Operation

- Sewing machine operation
- Types of stitches and practical stitching session
- Time management in garment production
- Practice session



### Day 3: Advanced Skills and Maintenance

- Advanced stitching practice
- Sewing machine troubleshooting
- Basic repairing techniques
- Regular maintenance of sewing machines
- Doubt clearing and guidance for self-employment





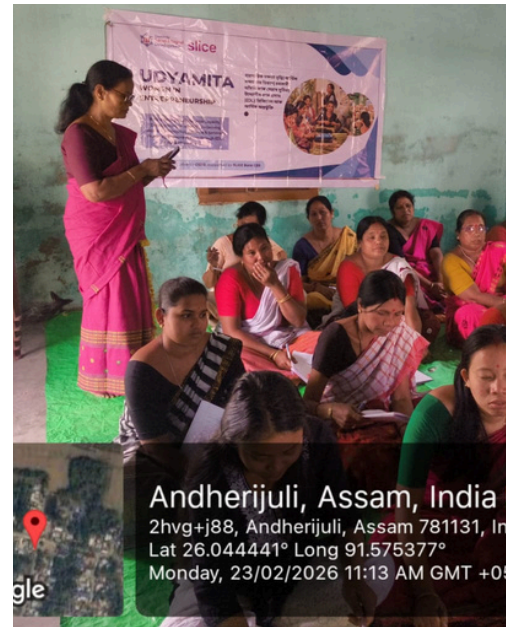

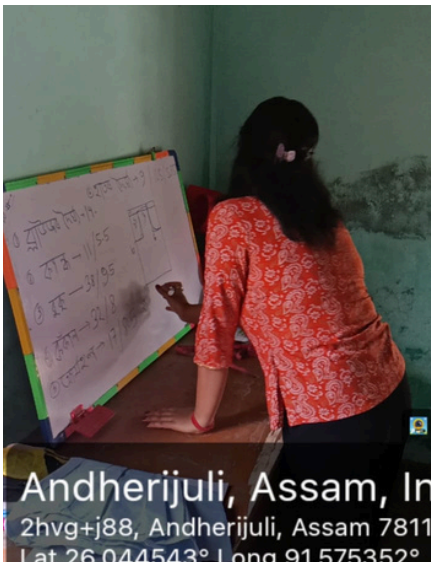

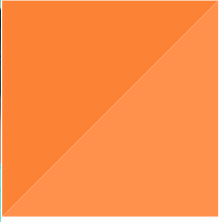

## 4.2 HANDLOOM TRAINING PROGRAMME



A three-day Handloom Training Programme was successfully conducted for Rural Women Entrepreneurs (RWEs) at Rani Bazar Chowk, Rani, Kamrup (R), Assam, from 23rd February to 25th February 2026. The training provided practical, in-depth knowledge on handloom operations and jacquard techniques to strengthen the technical skills and income-generating skills of the participants.

### OBJECTIVES OF THE TRAINING

- To provide practical knowledge on bobbin binding and Bati Kata process.
- To train participants on weaving measurements and frame installation.
- To introduce jacquard design techniques and design card usage.
- To create awareness on safety measures in handloom operations.
- To provide knowledge on basic maintenance and repair of jacquard machines.

### TRAINER DETAILS

The training was conducted by Mr. Dinesh Nath, WSC Certified Trainer, having 30 years of experience in the handloom sector. Being a resident of the Rani area, he shared extensive practical knowledge and local industry insights with the participants. His expertise ensured thorough understanding of each module covered during the training programme.

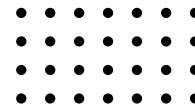
### TRAINING MODULES COVERED

The handloom training focused on enhancing technical weaving capabilities, specifically focusing on jacquard machinery.

#### Day 1: Preparatory Processes

- Introduction to handloom tools and setup
- Bobbin binding process
- Bati Kata techniques
- Weaving measurements and calculations



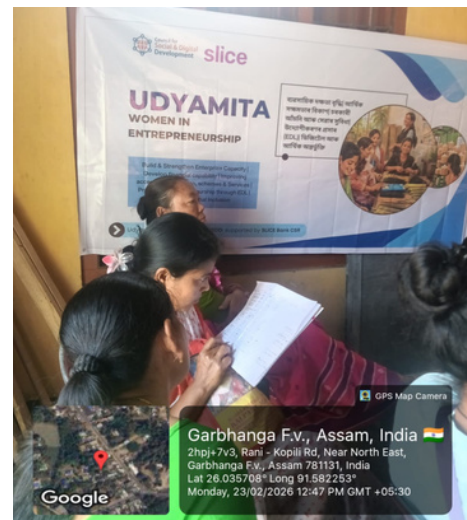


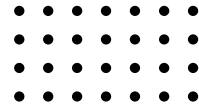
## Day 2: Installation and Design

- Frame installation and loom setup
- Safety measures during handloom operation
- Introduction to jacquard design
- Understanding and preparation of design cards

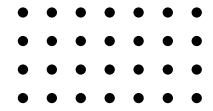
## Day 3: Technical Execution and Maintenance

- Practical weaving session with jacquard design
- Basic maintenance of jacquard machines
- Repairing techniques for jacquard mechanism
- Doubt clearing and guidance for self-employment opportunities

The sessions were designed to be interactive, featuring practical demonstrations and significant hands-on exposure under expert guidance.

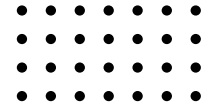
## **Participant Satisfaction:**
